

Ann Lacy School of American Dance and Arts Management Dance Foundation Curriculum Comparison

The Ann Lacy School of American Dance and Arts Management is dedicated to preparing dancers to work as performers, teachers, choreographers, and arts/entertainment managers. Students selected through the audition process enter as dance majors. They take a foundation curriculum of dance technique, arts management and production, teaching dance, choreography, dance history, music fundamentals, and general education courses in the first 2 years. Students are placed in one of the 3 dance major degree tracks (Dance Performance, Dance Teacher, or Dance Management) for their junior and senior years. Placement in the degree for which students are best matched is based on the students' interests and faculty evaluation of their skills, knowledge, and accomplishments.
