- Valid I-20 for F-1 and F-2 dependent(s) with a travel signature
- Valid passport
- Valid visa

Optional but recommended documents

- Proof of financial resources
- Proof of full-time enrollment
- Student ID card, Good Standing letter from the Registrar's Office, current transcripts

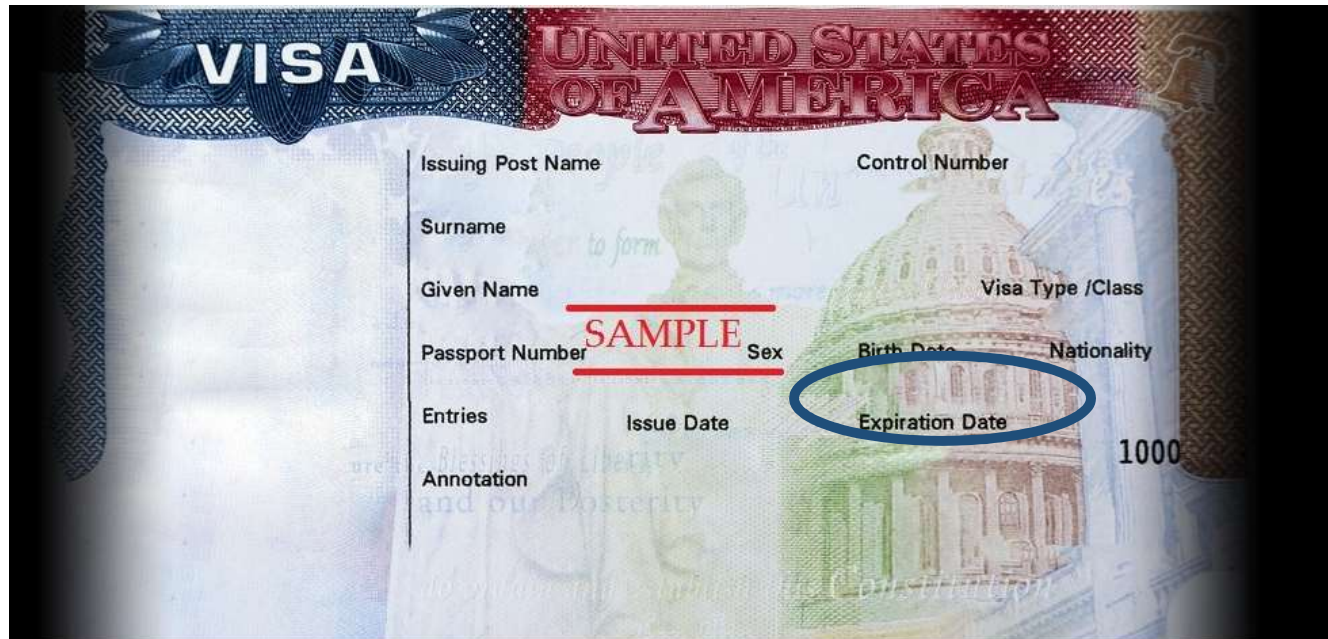

Make sure that your passport is travel ready!

Hold a valid passport with an expiration date that is at least six months beyond the date you want to re-enter the U.S.



Always travel with a valid F-1 Visa. If your visa is expired, you will need to renew your F-1 visa at the U.S. Consulate/Embassy Office in your home country in order to re-enter the U.S



A bank statement, a letter from your sponsor or a scholarship award letter should cover one year of expenses that you are responsible as indicated on the first page of your I-20

Your re-entry to the U.S. is ultimately decided by the CBP officer at the port of entry. You must be prepared to produce all documentation that will prove that you are returning to employment.

Additional Information

- You can remain in the U.S. with an expired visa as long as your I-20 is valid.
- You have to RENEW your EXPIRED VISA in your home country if you travel outside the U.S.
- No restriction on travel within the U.S. (no travel signature is required.)
- There is no requirement to be enrolled during the summer semester
- You have up to 60 days to depart the U.S. after the completion of your degree
